

#### Comments on the Lisburn and Castlereagh City Council LDP Draft Strategy Document

As per our consultation response CRF are generally of the opinion that the LDP Draft Strategy Documents are SOUND and a comprehensive strategy with policies in place to:

- allow flexibility to support the right kind of development, and
- provide control measures to allow for the protection of existing assets/environments and exclude inappropriate development, where applicable.

The CRF note that the success, or otherwise, of the council LDP will depend upon how the plan is implemented.

In addition, we would wish to state the following items to be considered in the overall review of the documents:

- It is generally accepted that the provision of services and associated infrastructure has not kept pace with the development of housing schemes with the Carryduff area. Therefore, the CRF committee propose that no additional land is zoned for housing redevelopment;
- Accessible open green space within Carryduff is limited and therefore existing spaces are highly
  valued by members of the community. Existing community open spaces must be protected
  from development or potential erosion of quality through the policies set out within the LDP;
- Public realm improvements within Carryduff are essential to prevent the further decline of the
  town centre area. The residents of the town deserve a more considered, quality environment
  which gives greater priority to pedestrians and cyclists, creates a perception of arrival at a
  'destination' and contributes to a sense of place. Much-needed improvements should not be
  dependent on the (private commercial) redevelopment of the existing shopping centre site but
  rather CRF propose that the Council should take the initiative in the improvement of areas as a
  way of kick-starting regeneration and increasing the attractiveness of an area to potential
  investors;
- Sustainable transport solutions must be a key priority within the LDP. The Carryduff Greenway
  is a proposal which has the potential to deliver key benefits associated with health and wellbeing through active travel in addition to environmental gains. Initial momentum for this
  proposal should not be lost and robust policies to enable further development of this scheme
  should be considered;
- Ambitious strategies which promote opportunities for local employment should be put in place.
   The redevelopment of the Knockbracken Healthcare site as a zone for employment should be a priority;
- Carryduff is designated as a town centre, along with Moira and Hillsborough & Culcavy. Page 97
  of Part 1 of the Plan states that 'The towns of Carryduff, Moira, Hillsborough & Culcavy provide a
  level and scale of service provision consummate with their place in the hierarchy (retail) and
  meeting the daily and weekly needs of the surrounding population.......for the towns of
  Carryduff, Hillsborough & Culcavy and Moira the level of potential market interest in the future is

more likely to relate to modest additions to the convenience retail offer, rather than significant comparison retail opportunities.'
